# Category: Code Composer Studio v5

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## Overview

**Code Composer Studio v5.1** is a mass market release for all customers. The main objective of this release is to bring CCS to the latest version of Eclipse with no modifications ('Stock Eclipse'). This allows customers to integrate a wider range of 3rd party plugins (as compared to CCSv4.x) and allows upgrades of open source components of CCS.

There are also many other improvements including improvements in performance, usability and stability.



Customers with valid maintenance subscriptions will be able to upgrade to CCSv5.1. CCSv5.1 is based on Indigo Eclipse release train.

# **Getting Started**

CCSv5 flow is slightly different from CCSv4 as we now rely more on standard Eclipse workflow. See StartingDebugger topic for differences related to starting debug sessions. It is recommended that you read information below follow prior to using CCSv5.

## **Customizing perspectives for GNU Tools**

For some customers, the JTAG debug capabilites provided by CCS may be secondary to using the GNU toolchain. In these cases, the install image can be customized to make the GNU tool perspectives the default. To do this, download and uncompress the install image. Create a folder called "extras" at the same level as the "install\_images" folder. Add the contents of this to the folder.
